First to put up a Christmas tree in the White House: Franklin Pierce, in 1856

First to watch a professional baseball game: Benjamin Harrison, on June 6, 1892, when Cincinnati beat Washington, 7-4, in 11 innings

First to throw out the first pitch: William Howard Tait, on April 14, 1910, when the Washington Senators beat the Philadelphia Athletics, 3-0

First to live in the White House: John Adams

First and only son of a president to become a president: John Quincy Adams

First to be born in a log cabin: Andrew Jackson

First to be born a U.S. citizen: Martin Van Buren. The first 7 presidents had been born British subjects.

First elected from a state west of the Mississippi River: Zachary Taylor. He lived in Louisiana.

First to use a telephone while in office: Rutherford B. Hayes

First and only president to be granted a patent for an invention: Abraham Lincoln, patent 6469, in 1849. Lincoln invented a floatable device to allow steamboats to pass over shallow waters.

First to change his name: Ulysses S. Grant. He dropped his original first name, Hiram, because he disliked it.

First to be left-handed: James Garfield

First to win the Nobel Peace Prize: Theodore Roosevelt, 1906, for mediating the peace between Russia and Japan. The two countries had fought the Russo-Japanese War in 1905.

First disabled president: Franklin D. Roosevelt. A case of polio in 1921 had paralyzed his legs, but he learned to walk again with the aid of leg braces and a cane.

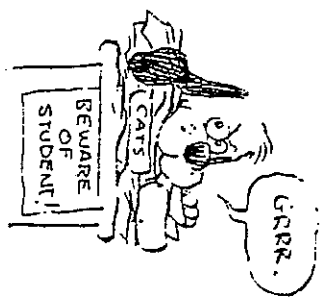
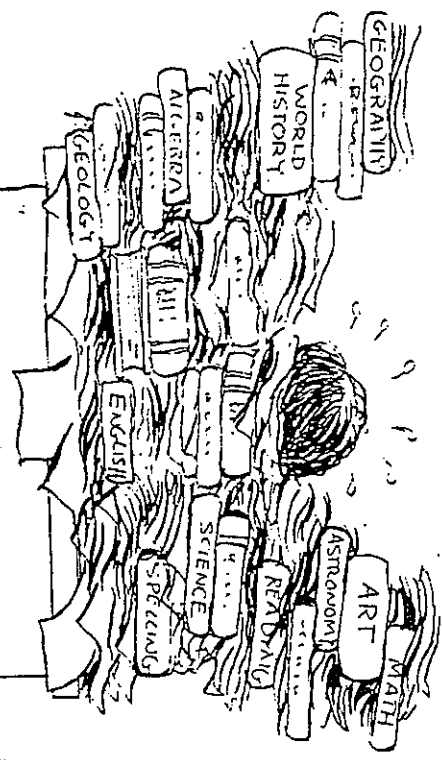
